



Dr Hirotsugu Aiga is the Professor and MPH Course Director at School of Tropical Medicine & Global Health, Nagasaki University. He has been committed to addressing a variety of global health issues in both development and emergency phases for over 30 years, not only as a researcher but also as a practitioner.
